

Snapshot of Barry House Health Team

2016-2017

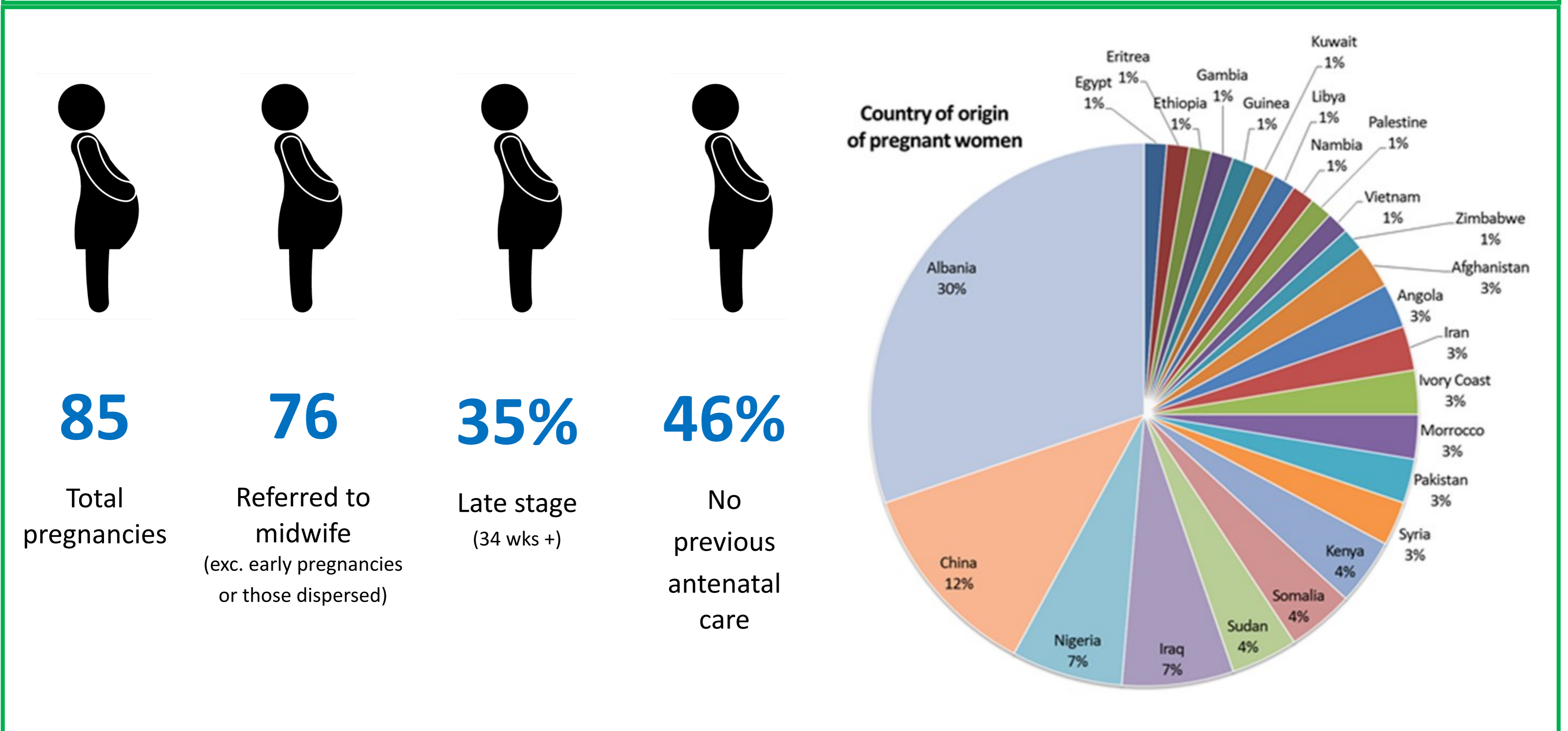
Barry House is a mixed initial accommodation (temporary residence) for asylum seekers. It has 57 rooms accommodating approximately 150 people.

Clients may have just arrived in the country or have been living in the UK for some time but have recently become destitute. Clients tend to stay overnight or up to several weeks.

The Health Team in Barry House have been commissioned by NHS England to provide a screening service. The team consists of two full-time nurses, a health visitor, an OT, an OT Technician, an administrator and, a Health Improvement Specialist. External services that come in to the hostel include a GP and community midwife.


