- 51 projects operating across all 32 London boroughs
- 2 Women-Only shelters Tower Hamlets & Hackney
- 1 Open-Access shelter The Haven, Kingston
- 12 year-round shelters (green font)
- 21 single/static site projects
- 30 multiple venue/circuit projects with as few as 3 to as many as 23 different venues on each including synagogues, mosques, community centre buildings and even a derelict building (The Glasshouse)

With the exception of Westminster, Barnet & GrowTH who all operate through to the end of May, all other winter shelters are closed by the end of March



Headline Info 3

Governing charities & operating budgets:

- 16 projects have a governing charity set up specifically for the winter shelter
- 3 projects currently do not have a governing charity (although 1 of those is currently in process)
- All other projects fall under the auspices of charities set up with other charitable aims but which have incorporated the shelter into their portfolio of services – this includes Salvation Army, YMCA, Simon Community, Ashford Place, West London Mission

Lowest operating budget currently is £12k


Capacity & Occupancy 1

- Glass Door currently operate a 7-venue circuit project in the 4 London boroughs of K+C, H+F, Wandsworth & Richmond all with a 35 bed capacity
- FCENS operate with a 30 bed capacity and a few other projects extend to around the 20+ mark
- Otherwise the norm is 14-16 beds
- Average occupancy over the winter operating period across the network is currently at the 73% mark

2018 GRANT PROGRAMME PROSPECTUS




The ESP programme & sustainable routes off the streets

- We awarded more than £220,000 in grant over the 2018/19 winter months
- We worked with more than 29 projects to create 169 additional winter night shelter beds
- We supported projects to help more than 300 guests from rough sleeping to more settled accommodation
- In addition the London Catalyst Team held dozens of events, trainings and provided a range of support to projects across the capital.




Mind Map – Pathways Out of Homelessness

Evidence from our equipping shelters case studies is that good quality case management is integral to achieving move on, which raises questions about the implementation of casework at some shelters and whether the quality of case work is appropriate at all locations.
