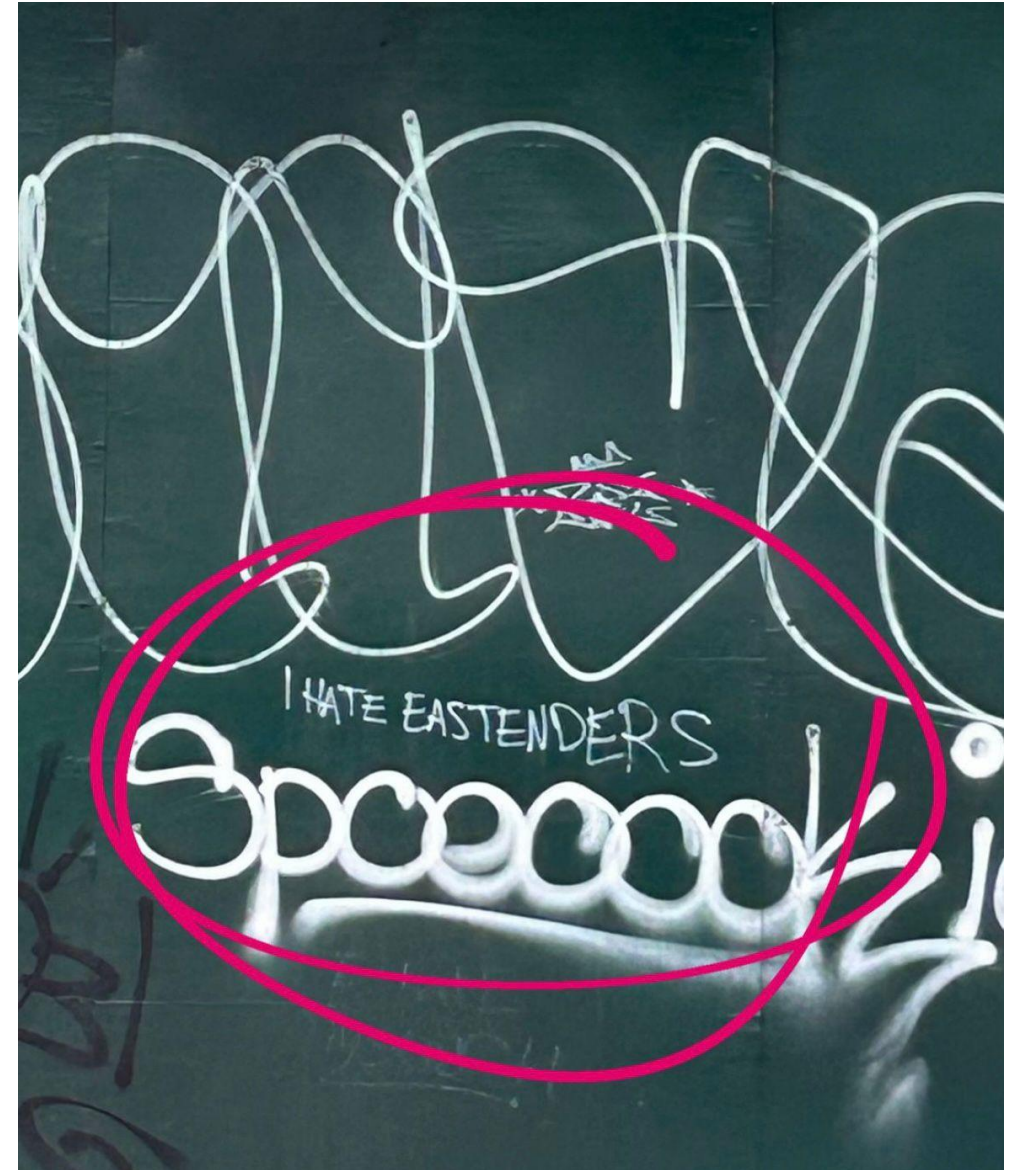

# Leeds team

- Sees the patient where they are, In reach, Outreach, Inclusion model
- Identifies patients experiencing homelessness in hospital
- Optimises admission, Specialist assessment by Nurse, OT, GP, Navigator
- Works closely with Transfer of Care hub
- Coordinates and contributes to safe discharge
- Continued casework post hospital discharge, home visiting.
- Out of hospital placements, 9 flats in Transitional housing units, 2 beds in city centre hostel
- Out of hospital team expands the MDT to Specialist Social Worker, Primary Care Outreach, Housing Officer, Support work.
- Gypsy and Traveller outreach
- Host Specialist post leading on multi agency “Our Gaff Leeds” project (formally SHAP)
- Share a Navigator post with St Gemma’s Hospice Health Inclusion team



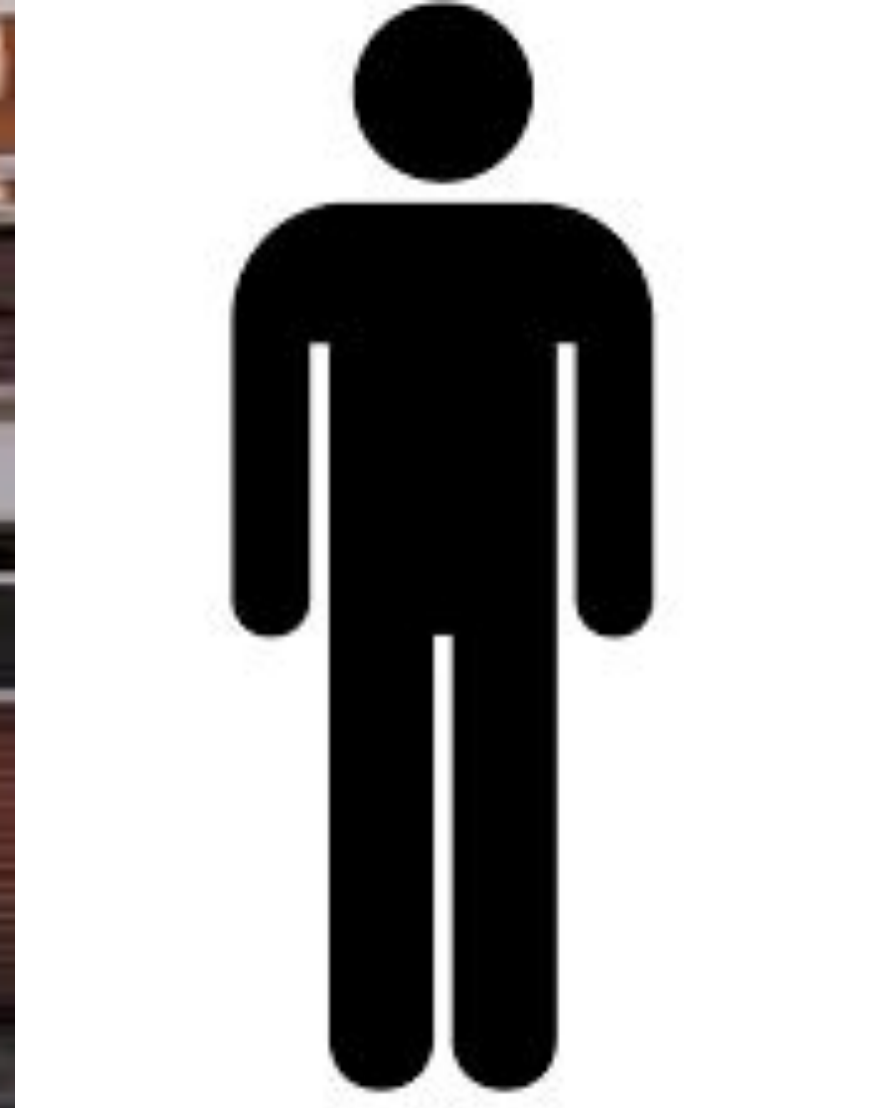

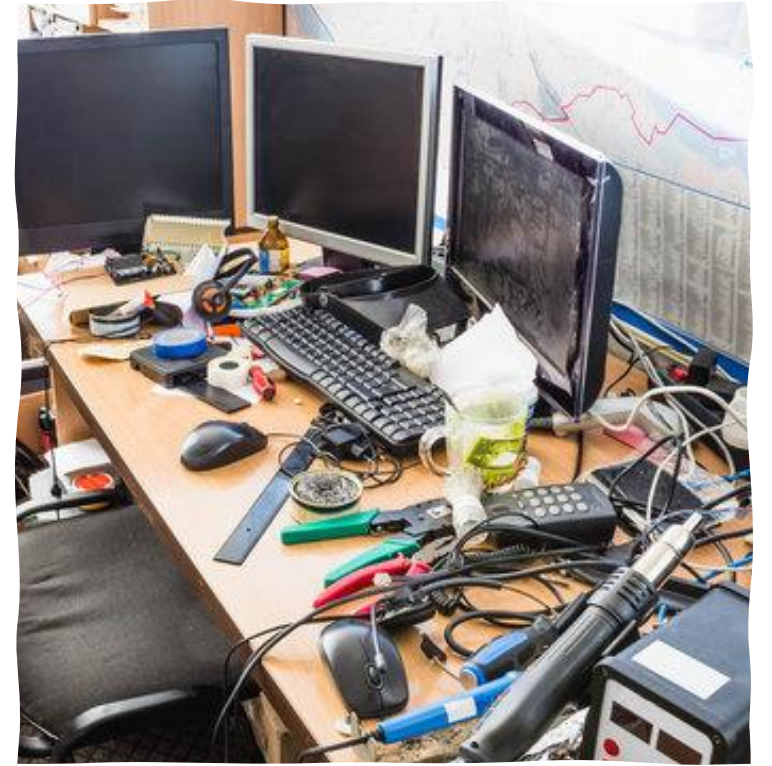
GP registration LS27 6 options

- Have we been seduced by order, measurement and control? What is that stopping us seeing?
- What do I know that my training, systems and organisations have taught me to ignore?
- Look for the messiness, combine funding, opportunity. We are not designed to be in straight lines
